Prep for Nursing School

If you are considering a career in the medical field, you should enroll in our Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Course. This 76 hour course is a great way to get a feel for this field without a large investment. And since you will eventually need to complete this course for a nursing degree, you will be one step ahead when you start your higher education journey.



Consider a College Alternative

Two or four-year colleges are not for everyone. Explore a career as a CNA or CMA to work in the medical field immediately upon graduation. A CNA requires 76 hours of coursework and CMA requires only 40 hours.

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CNA

A Certified Nursing Assistant, or CNA, helps patients with healthcare needs under the supervision of a RN or LPN. Working closely with patients in a health care facility, hospital or in their home, you'll complete such tasks as checking vital signs, making up patient beds and assisting patients with personal tasks. Must be 16 within 3 months of class completion to enroll.

76 hours: 44 hours online and 32 hours in the classroom

A Certified Medication Aide administers routine oral medications and is responsible for monitoring a patient's vitals and behavior while on medication. The CMA training program will prepare you for work in a health care facility (e.g. Assisted Living, nursing facility, hospital) or in a residential setting (e.g. in-home care). Must be 18 within 3 months of class completion to enroll.

40 hours: 24 hours online and 16 hours in the classroom

CMA

PHARM

This Pharmacy Technician Program is a 12-week course that combines online learning, in-class checkpoints, and onsite training. Through a partnership with CHI Health, students will have the opportunity to experience both retail and inpatient settings. Must be 18 and a high school graduate or have a GED to enroll.



166 hours: 124 hours online, 10 hours on-campus checkins, 32 hours externship at CHI Health

This one-day CNA Pediatric Program, authored by Omaha's Children's Hospital and Medical Center, will teach you how to adapt your CNA skills in order to care for children. Additionally, it will prepare you to work within hospital and clinic settings.



7 hours: 3.5 hours online prior to 3.5 hours in the classroom

Note: You need to have your CNA Certification prior to taking this course.

PEDS

BLS

Most hospitals and clinics require their CNA and CMA employees to also have their (BLS) Basic Life Support Certification from the American Heart Association. This includes skills such as proper CPR techniques, AED instruction and how to remove airway obstructions in both adults and infants. No age requirement to enroll.
